Doing church right

The Power of the Church Gathered

“Do this in remembrance of Me.” Jesus spoke these words with the cross clearly in view, His imminent death shaping His final instructions to the disciples. They did not understand the significance of His words, and their own sense of confusion likely prevented them from inquiry.

The Churches of God recently took part in the Lord’s Supper. A sense of solemnity certainly marked our gatherings as we remembered *Christ slain for sinners*. No words can express this gift. Yet, in simple and holy praise, we join the chorus of heaven: “Worthy is the Lamb.”

Reflecting on this season also brings us to another moment, when the angel declared, “He is risen! He is not here” (Mark 16:6, NKJV throughout).

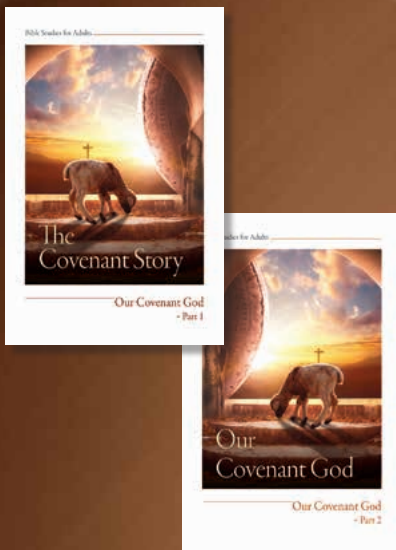
After His resurrection, Jesus appeared to two disciples on the road to Emmaus. As He joined them, notice the context: “they talked . . . conversed and reasoned . . . of all . . . which had happened” (Luke 24:14, 15). This was no light conversation; this was a wrestling with and deep reflection on the things these disciples did not yet understand. Like the Twelve, they did not comprehend all that God was doing. But despite that, our Lord honored their talking and reasoning by *joining their discussion*.

Here, then, is the power of the church gathered: Despite our limitations, the Lord – by the power of the Holy Spirit – joins our discussions and opens to us the Scripture and the things concerning Himself (v. 27).

Note also this amazing detail: As they ate with the Lord, “their eyes were opened and they knew Him” (vv. 30, 31). This is the power of the church’s fellowship. As we gather in His name to consider Him, Jesus opens our understanding. As we assemble and break bread together, He makes Himself known.

Family of God, do not forget: There is no other place in the world like the church. It is God’s sanctuary, His voice, and His people. As we approach our biennial convention and as you read this edition of *Church-right* of all the events and happenings, make sure you join in whenever and wherever you can, knowing the Lord will meet us there.

It's baptism season! All over the world, lives are being transformed as people take the step of faith and go down in the waters of baptism. In Las Vegas alone, eleven precious souls were

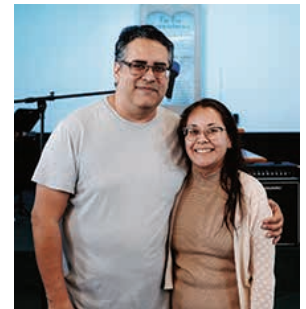


baptized between the two churches! Baptisms were also celebrated across the West Coast District – in San Jose and Ontario, California; Mesa, Arizona; and other places.

We are especially blessed to meet and work with these amazing candidates. The work is sometimes arduous, but it is tremendously rewarding!

Preparing the Next Generation of Pastors

The Church of God (Seventh Day) is committed to raising up faithful, equipped pastors to serve the body of Christ. During the upcoming General Conference Convention, a special meeting will be held for students and potential students studying pastoral ministry through Artios Christian College, as well as those wanting to advance to license or credentials. This gathering is a valuable opportunity to connect,

encourage, and outline the next steps toward pastoral ministry within our church.

One of the key areas we will discuss is the process by which pastoral candidates are evaluated and affirmed in the ministry. In the Church of God (Seventh Day), this important responsibility is handled by the License and Credentials Committee (L&CC). This committee ensures that candidates meet both the biblical and organizational standards necessary for a local pastor certificate, license, or credentials.

The meeting will also walk students through the formal requirements for pastoral ministry. These include completing appropriate theological education, demonstrating character and leadership in a local congregation, securing pastoral mentoring, and fulfilling the experiential and doctrinal standards outlined by the Church. A clear path will be presented, helping students understand each stage of preparation – from initial education to the application for licensing and credentials.

The goal is to support future pastors not only in their studies but also in their spiritual development and readiness to serve. We invite all interested students, current ministerial workers, and those considering a calling to pastoral work to attend. Together, we will explore how God is preparing leaders for His church and how we can walk faithfully in that calling.

We are excited to see how the Spirit is moving among the next generation of leaders and excited to partner with each of you in answering God's call.
